Celebrating Reading and Black History throughout the month of February


Students will be reading stories from around the world. In February students will take time to stop, drop and read, no matter what else may be going on in the classroom. We



Chipmunk Chatter from the Bear's Backyard



In 3rd grade, Tamarack naturalists come to VHES and talk about "What's For Lunch?". Part of the class is studying different skulls of animals that can be found in MN. By looking at the tooth structure, students can determine if the animal was a carnivore, omnivore or herbivore. The second part of the class is to go out into our very own Bear's Backyard, the 7 acre prairie & wetland area behind our school. Students, along with the help from



the naturalists visiting from Tamarack Nature Center, find signs of animals and what they might have had for lunch. Third grade students saw prints of mice and raccoons. They also found gull flies hibernating, pileated woodpecker holes, and tracks from deer and coyote.








Exciting news:
