Dear Vadnais Heights Families,

I am so excited for the 2020-2021 school year. I know it will look and feel different; nonetheless, we fully intend to continue to provide our students with a world class education whether they are in-person or learning from home.

Many have asked, "How will it look and feel different this year?" I hope to answer that question with the most current information in this letter. Please remember that our situation is ever evolving as we learn more about the virus and how to ensure protocols, schedules, and routines are safe for our students and staff.

Please reference our district's <u>website</u> for the most up to date information regarding our return to school and safety guidelines.

Fall Welcome Conferences -

Teachers are anxious to meet their students and we are coordinating Fall Welcome Conferences to align with your education preference for the start of this school year:

- Families whose children are attending school, Hybrid, will meet in person, with your child's homebase teacher, for approximately 25 minutes. This will allow time to visit and the teacher will conduct a short reading assessment. In addition, students will meet one on one with an intervention teacher for a reading assessment while at school.
- Families whose children are Distance Learning full-time will have a 15 minute, virtual
 conference to meet and connect with your child's homebase teacher. In addition,
 they will complete reading assessments virtually with an intervention teacher on
 another day.

Conferences with classroom teachers, both 25 and 15 minute, will be held on the following dates. There will be directions outside of our school to support social distancing at this event.

^{**} Your flexibility is appreciated in the event we need to adjust homebase teachers to balance our class sizes.

^{**}Full-time distance learning students will be assessed virtually, during the 1st and 2nd week of school, to complete reading assessments.

Academics -

All students will have a learning board that will cover the content areas - reading, writing, math, social emotional, physical education, music, world language, social studies and science. The learning board will be the same for hybrid and distance learning students. Monday - Thursday there will be online, live opportunities for all students who are distance learning and on Fridays there will be some opportunities for online learning. If students miss or aren't able to view the live sessions they will be recorded and available to access at your convenience.

Chromebooks -

Kindergarten and 1st Grade - Chromebooks will be available for every student. The Chromebooks will stay in-school for our young students who are attending in -school or hybrid, and families whose children are full-time distance learning may request a Chromebook to have at home if needed.

2nd - 5th grade students will be required to bring their <u>fully charged</u> Chromebooks (and chargers just in case) to and from school each day they are in-person learning.

Hybrid/In-person learners:

- Please have your child(ren) bring their <u>fully charged</u> Chromebooks to school on their first day of in-person learning, which would be...

- Please make sure your child(ren) also has a pair of earbuds or headphones for use at home and at school each day.

^{**}Absolutely **no** parents/guardians or other adult family members will be allowed into the school building during our morning arrivals. We will have extra staff in the building to assist students with getting breakfast (if applicable) and/or to their classrooms.

^{**}If your student walks or bikes to school, they should arrive at the time mentioned above and enter through the appropriate door.

End of the Day Departure -

In order to adequately social distance our students during departure, we must stagger the pick-up times and ask that families strictly adhere to these times.

^{**}Absolutely **no** parents/guardians or other adult family members will be allowed into the school building during our afternoon departure. Students will be escorted out to the sidewalk to meet the adult waiting in the vehicle. Adults - please stay in your car.

^{**}If a family arrives early, blocking traffic, you will be asked to exit the parking lot and re-enter at your child's pick up time.

^{**}Families may also be asked to park if their child is delayed in the building to allow for a constant flow of traffic.

^{**}If your student walks or bikes home, they will be dismissed at the same time as their class and the expectation will be that they leave our school grounds immediately.

Breakfast -

Students who have breakfast at school will continue to receive that service. Breakfast will be delivered to the classrooms.

Lunch -

- Students will eat with their class either in their classrooms or in the cafeteria. Classes will rotate weekly so all students will have an opportunity to eat in the cafeteria.
 - While in the cafeteria, students will...
 - thoroughly wash hands prior to going
 - collect a pre-packaged meal or eat their home lunch
 - have assigned tables for their class
 - tables will be designated for students with food allergies
 - sit with one seat in between each other
 - sit on one side of the table
 - thoroughly wash hands before returning to class
 - o In between classes visiting the cafeteria...
 - staff will thoroughly sanitize surfaces of tables
 - While in the classrooms, students will...
 - thoroughly wash hands prior to going to the cafeteria to collect their pre-packaged meal or their home lunch
 - eat at their designated desk or table in the classroom
 - thoroughly wipe down and sanitize their desk or table
 - thoroughly wash their hands after all of the above

Recess -

- Students will be assigned to a two to three classroom cohort, depending on class size, for outdoor recess activities. There will be one adult assigned to each cohort
- Indoor recess:
 - The staff responsible for supervising the cohort will also do so during inside recess in case of inclement weather. In this case.
 - the students will remain in their classrooms.
 - The cohorts of classrooms are next to each other, which makes it easy for the supervisor to monitor classrooms to ensure social distancing.

Daily Routines -

- Masks ALL students and staff will be required to wear facial masks or other
 coverings (such as gaiters, bandanas, etc.,) during the school day and on the buses.
 Staff will also have the option to wear a clear face shield in addition to masks.
 Students can also wear a face shield in addition to their mask, but it is not required.
 - We will have several opportunities where students will be able to remove their facial coverings throughout the school day:
 - Lunch (20 min)
 - Recess (20 min)
 - Outdoor learning with their classes (time will vary)
 - PE (25 min)
 - Only students with severe medical conditions, as directed from a physician, will be exempt from facial coverings.
 - The state will supply all students in Minnesota with one cloth face mask which will be distributed at school at a date yet to be determined.
- Social Distancing Staff will teach and guide students in how to maintain a 6ft distance from others. We will need your help in engaging in conversations with your child(ren) about social distancing and its importance.
 - Desks/tables will be placed 6 feet apart in classrooms.
 - When students need to walk through the hallways and/or stand in lines, staff will teach and guide students how to stay 6 feet apart.
- **Hand-washing** Staff will remind students to wash their hands before and after the following activities:
 - Using classroom materials (books, games, math manipulatives, etc.)
 - Music, PE, World Language
 - Recess
 - Lunch
 - Leaving/returning the classroom for any reason

- If I bring lunch from home, I will walk with my class to the cafeteria and wait patiently while the other kids get their meal.
- Some days we will eat in our classrooms and other days we will eat in the cafeteria.
- After I finish eating, I will clean my area and I will throw my lunch debris into the assigned trash can.

Recess

- I wash my hands before and after recess.
- I stay with my class and the other class that joins us and follow the supervisor's directions.
- Our class will play in different areas each day, and we will stay with our supervisor at all times.
- I will make sure I am safe while playing with my friends.

Specialists

 - Deadline for registration to start the first day of school is Wednesday, August 26.
 - Parents will be required to submit an employment verification letter for student(s) to attend.

If your child is a full-time distance learning student they will begin on Monday, September 14th. The preschool program, at our school, also begins on 9/14/2020.
